About the Degree

- Classes begin every October and February

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Applying for Admission

For consideration, applicants must submit the following documents to the Office of Graduate Admissions:

1. A completed application
2. An original essay of at least 300-500 words on the topic “Why the graduate program in Special Education Administrator is important to me, my career and professional goals, and my life?”
3. Undergraduate and graduate transcripts (a GPA of 3.0 is preferred)
4. A current resume
5. Two recommendations (form can be found online)
6. A signed program requirement form
7. A copy of your teaching license
8. Passing scores on the Communication and Literacy Skills portion of the Massachusetts Tests for Educator Licensure (MTEL)
9. Confirmation of a current ASE membership
10. Confirmation from MA DESE of eligibility for licensure

Degree Requirements

Prospective students may apply for admissions to the MSEd/EdS in Special Education Administrator program throughout the year. Applicants will be reviewed by the Graduate Faculty Committee to determine the right course of study for each applicant.

This graduate program is for students who currently hold either:

- An initial license in special education, or a certificate as a school guidance counselor, school principal/assistant school principal, school psychologist, school social worker/school adjustment counselor, or speech, language and hearing disorders teacher and completion of three full years of employment in a district-wide, school-based, or other educational setting, **or**
- Completion of at least three full years of employment in law, public policy, higher education, or other related field accepted by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education.
