About Watertown

Watertown is a vibrant, culturally diverse community of four square miles, located just sixmiles west of Boston. It is a town of 33,000 inhabitants that is rich in history and broad in its ethnic makeup.

It was founded in 1630 by the English under the leadership of Sir Richard Saltonstall because of its proximity to the Charles River. The town was governed by a Board of Selectmen - the first town in the country to have an official town meeting form of government. Watertown was among the earliest leaders in public education: the first school house was erected here in 1649.

Advanced Placement

In May 2005, 68 students took a total of 122 AP Exams and 98% of the students enrolled in AP courses took the exams.

CULTURAL DIVERSITY

For the Class of 2005, 64% of SAT takers spoke "English only", compared with 83% "English only" in Massachusetts. 17 % spoke "English and another language", compared to 9% in Massachusetts. For the Watertown Class of 2005, 19% spoke mainly "another language" at home. In Massachusetts only 8% of the students chose "another language".

43 languages other than English are spoken by students in the Watertown Public Schools.

697 Watertown students, 29% of the K-12 student population, listed a language other than English as the first language they spoke at home. Of those 262, or 37.5% of ELLs (and 9.8% of the total), are considered Limited English Proficiency students and are receiving language support services.

480 students in grades K-12, 20.5%, come from low income families, as determined by federal qualifications for free or reduced lunch.

In 2004-2005, 3.4 % of students in grades K-12 described themselves as Black/African American, 5.5% described themselves as Asian, 6.9% described themselves as Hispanic, 0.6% described themselves as American Indian, and 83.5% described themselves as White/Caucasian.

20% of the student population is foreign born and for 26% of the students, English is not their first language.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

The Watertown Adult Education Program works toward building an active partnership between the community and the schools.

The program provides lifelong learning and enrichment opportunities by offering classes and activities for citizens of all ages. Before School Programs operate at all three elementary schools, providing care for children PreK-5. Extended day programs operate for the convenience of Watertown families and a teen center is offered at the Middle School.

STUDENT SUPPORT & EXPECTATIONS

Standards Based Grade Level/Course Outcomes

The Watertown Public Schools has a K-12 curriculum that is consistent from classroom to classroom, grade to grade, and school to school. Standards Based grade level/course outcomes state learning expectations in user friendly language so that parents can better understand what students are expected to know and be able to do at the end of each year in each grade level and in each subject.

Support Services

The Watertown Public Schools is committed to providing support services for students with special needs and for students who need assistance in acquiring the English language. Reading Recovery instruction is provided for students in Grade 1 and Language Arts Support Teachers strengthen Language Arts instruction for all students in grades 3-5.

Technology Integration

In addition to computers in every classroom, each school has a state of the art computer lab.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must pass the state required MCAS exams and have 134 credits to graduate. Students need to complete four years of English, 3 years of Mathematics and Science, and three years of Social Studies. A health course must be completed during freshman or sophmore year. The Physical Education requirement is successful completion of three semester courses. One year of courses in Fine, Applied, and Performing Arts or Occupational Education is required as well as at least thirty-six hours of Community Serivce. Lastly, students must also complete a Senior Thesis through their English class.
